

WELCOME LETTER

Whether in Wilmington, Pittsburgh, Bradenton, Cooperstown, or even when traveling out of the country, Willie would quietly disappear three times a week for several hours to undergo his dialysis treatments. He never once complained.

During the five years Willie was in and out of the dialysis unit in Wilmington that now bears his name at Novant Health, he often said he wished patients could be warmer during treatments and had something to occupy their minds to make them more comfortable during those long hours. It was in remembering Willie's wishes that the Willie Stargell Foundation was established in Wilmington, NC in 2002. So much has been done to assist those living with kidney disease, thanks to our very generous supporters of the Willie Stargell Foundation. It is our mission to continue honoring Willie's legacy in the manner and grace by which he lived his life...helping others.












TRIBUTE TO WILLIE




Known for his monstrous home runs, Willie "Pops" Stargell crushed 475 career home runs during his 21-year baseball career with the Pittsburgh Pirates (1962-1982). An intimidating left-handed hitter, Willie hit 7 of the 16 balls ever knocked completely out of Forbes Field. When most batters would use a simple lead-weighted bat in the on-deck circle, Willie warmed up with a sledgehammer.

Willie helped the Pittsburgh Pirates capture two World Series titles (1971, 1979). His father-figure status earned him the nickname "Pops". He was known to award his teammates gold Stars to place on their hats for a good play or game.

Willie Stargell was inducted in the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 1988.



ABOUT KIDNEY DISEASE

When people develop chronic kidney disease (CKD), their kidneys become damaged and over time may not clean the blood as well as healthy kidneys. If kidneys do not work well, toxic waste and extra fluid accumulate in the body and may lead to high blood pressure, heart disease, stroke, and early death. Kidney disease is the fastest-growing noncommunicable disease in the U.S.

- 9 out of 10 people with kidney disease are unaware they have it.
- There are 92,000 Americans on the kidney transplant waiting list in 2022, but in 2021, only 1 in
 5 were able to get a kidney.
- About 1 in 3 adults with diabetes and 1 in 5 adults with high blood pressure may have kidney disease.
- Kidney disease is slightly more common in women than men.
- The shortage of available donor kidneys means that the majority of people who develop kidney failure are treated with dialysis. In 2019 (most recent data), of the 135,000 Americans newly diagnosed with kidney failure, only 4,022 were able to receive a preemptive kidney transplant.

Nearly **810,000**

Americans are living with kidney disease.

DID YOU KNOW?

- · Kidney disease is a silent killer, usually with no signs or symptoms until late stages.
- Diabetes and high blood pressure are the more common causes of CKD in adults.
 Other risk factors include heart disease, obesity, a family history of CKD, inherited kidney disorders, past damage to the kidneys, and older age.
- Simple blood and urine tests can tell how well your kidneys are working. If you're at risk, talk to your doctor about getting tested.
- Early detection saves lives. When caught and treated early, it's often possible to slow or stop the progression of kidney disease and avoid serious complications.
- Being physically active, keeping a healthy weight, consuming a healthy diet, and getting tested for kidney disease can help protect your kidneys.







The Willie Stargell Foundation supports programs focusing on kidney disease research, patient care, and easing the financial burden of medical costs for patients facing kidney disease, in honor of Baseball Hall of Fame Member Willie Stargell of the Pittsburgh Pirates.

Stargell passed away in 2001 after a lengthy battle with renal failure.

Having spent the last five years of his life receiving dialysis treatments, it was his desire that patients who need dialysis are able to receive it, and that it be done in a comfortable and relaxed setting. Stargell's widow, Margaret Weller-Stargell, wanted to do everything in her power to make his wishes come true.

Funds for the foundation are raised through fundraising events such as the Willie Stargell 5K Road Race, Willie Stargell Celebrity Invitational, and private donations.





2023 CELEBRITY BIOGRAPHIES

KATRINA ADAMS. Chairperson of Fed Cup She competed professionally from 1988 to 1999, securing 20 doubles titles. Adams made history as the first African American and youngest person to become the Chairman, CEO, and

President of the USTA (2015-2018), promoting diversity and inclusion. Under her leadership, the USTA opened its National Campus and transformed the Billie Jean King National Tennis Center, expanding tennis into underserved communities. She's also a TV commentator and the author of "Own the Arena," published in 2021.

FLEX ALEXANDER. American Actor and Comedian

Flex Alexander is an American actor, comedian, and former dancer. He gained fame as Mark "Flex" Washington in the sitcom "One on One." Starting his career as a dancer with groups like Salt-N-Pepa, he later transitioned to acting with notable roles in "Girlfriends," "The Parkers," and as Michael Jackson in "Man in the Mirror." Along with his on-screen work, Alexander has explored roles behind the camera as a producer and director. He's also known for his reality TV show "Flex & Shanice," showcasing his family life with wife Shanice Wilson.

JAMES ARCENEAUX, Entertainment Industry After working in the entertainment business for over 20 years, Arceneaux now owns publishing company The Arceneaux Group, focusing on celebrity lifestyle and motivational books.

TRAVIS BEST, Retired NBA

After playing collegiate basketball at Georgia Tech, Best was drafted in 1995 by the Indiana Pacers. Over his career he also played for Chicago Bulls, Miami Heat, Dallas Mavericks, New Jersey Nets.



SUNSHINE CANES. Business Owner Sunshine is the charismatic owner of "Sunshine's Beach Bar & Grill" located in Navis. Known for the famous

"Killer Bee" cocktail and vibrant hospitality, Sunshine has become a symbol of the ultimate island welcome. His beach bar is a global attraction, earning a place in the Top Ten of Worldwide Restaurants by Trip Advisor.

JOHN CANDELARIA, Retired MLB

Candelaria was drafted by Pittsburgh in 1972 and went on to a very successful 19-year career. In 1977 he went 20-5 with a league leading 2.34 ERA. On August 9, 1976, he tossed a no-hitter, the 6th in club history.



ROBIN COLE, Retired NFL

After being drafted by the Pittsburgh Steelers, he played as a linebacker and member of the Steel Curtain defense for twelve seasons. A two time Super Bowl Champion (XIII and XIV),

All-Pro (1984), and Pro Bowl (1984) player, and since has spent his life on many charitable boards giving back to his community.

AURTHUR CULBREATH, Retired US Olympian

Culbreath won the silver medal in the 1995 Olympic Festival for team handball and was a player/coach during the 1997 Pan-Am Games. He is a WVU Tech Sports Hall of Fame inductee.



Sports Foundation ambassador, Evans founded the A.J.A. Foundation, launching the Beauty & The Beast Mode conference to support and inspire young girls and women. Her journey from a University of Illinois sports management student to an international athlete-entrepreneur symbolizes the realization of dreams through perseverance and empowerment.

JIM FOOR, Retired MLB
Jim Foor played baseball
for the Detroit Tigers and
Pittsburgh Pirates as a relief
pitcher. He is a first round
draft pick by the Tigers.



ANDREW GIVENS, Retired NFL

Givens is a retired tight end for the Packers and Broncos. His career also includes working in broadcast television as a station and sales manager. Givens currently serves as the vice-chair of the Willie Stargell Foundation.

DWIGHT HICKS, Retired NFL

Dwight is a former safety
primarily for the San Francisco
49ers. He won two Super Bowls
while earning four Pro Bowl
selections. In 1981, Dwight was
teamed up with Ronnie Lott, Eric

Wright and Carlton Williamson where the 49ers secondary would affectionately be known as "Dwight Hicks and his Hot Licks". After his football career, Dwight has appeared on TV and in film portraying characters in The Rock, Jack, Armageddon, In The Mix, The X-Files, How I Met Your Mother and others.

GARY HUDSON, Actor

Gary has amassed over 35 credits in film, TV, and stage, including classic films like "Road House" and series regular roles on shows like "As The World Turns." He has won Best Supporting Actor at the LA Film Festival for "Deadline" and was nominated for Best Actor at the Monte-Carlo International Film Festival for "Wild Roses." Besides acting, Gary is active in producing and directing, with upcoming projects including "The Johnny Unitas Story" and "Stormdancer," balancing his time between Canada and the USA as a dual citizen.



BRIAN HUNTER, Retired MLB

Hunter is a former MLB center fielder known for leading the MLB in stolen bases in 1997, and then the American League in 1999. Brian Hunter played for 10 seasons with teams including the Astros and Tigers.

KIRANI JAMES, Olympian

James is an Olympic sprinter
who dominates the 400m in less
than 44 seconds. He won gold
at the 2012 London Olympics
& silver at the '16 Rio de Janeiro
Olympics, and bronze at the 2020
Toyko Games. After battling Graves
Disease, James continued his comeback by taking
silver in 2021 at the World Championships.



Darin was a 5th round draft pick in 1988 for the Pittsburgh Steelers.
He also played with the Los Angeles Raiders and the San Francisco

49ers. He was part of the 49ers when they won Super Bowl XXIX.

BOB KENDRICK, Negro Leagues Baseball Museum President

Kendrick is responsible for the creation of several programs including the "Hall of Game" which honors MLB greats who played in the spirit and signature style of the Negro Leagues.




JAMES LAM Jim Lampl
